Adapted from an account given some years later by a German army officer who fought on the Western Front in 1918.

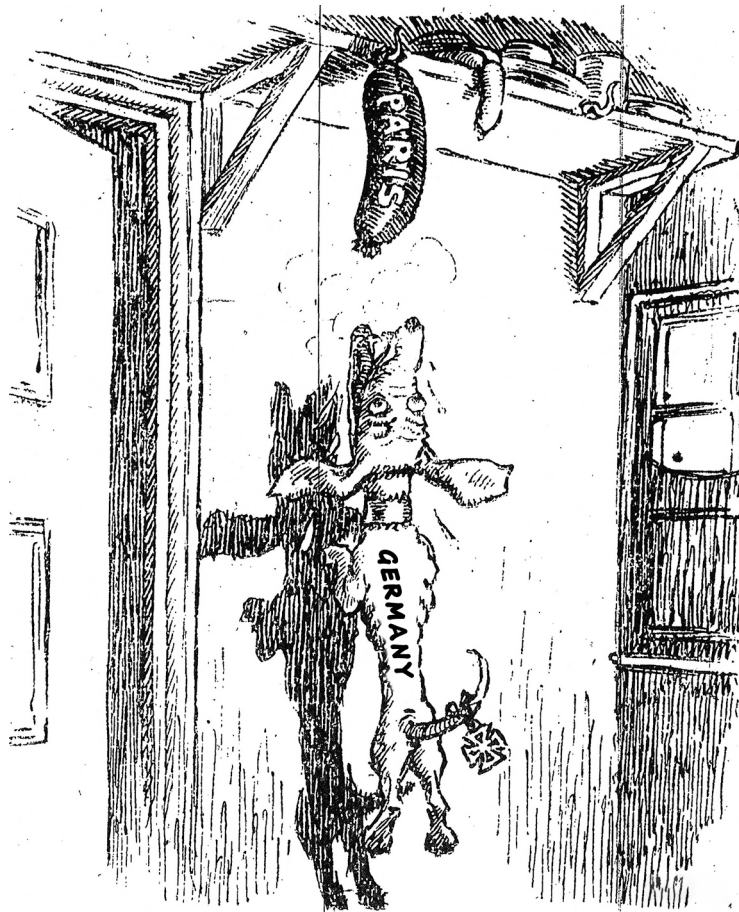
